What are Podcasts?

Podcasts are all the rage lately, especially due to the pandemic. They originate all the way back during the iPod craze of the 2000s, before phones replaced them. The name is the combination of "iPod" and "Broadcast" because they are an audio (and sometimes video) broadcast of a topic uploaded to the internet and used to be downloaded onto Apple iPod devices. Nowadays you can download or stream Podcasts on any device with an internet connection and speakers.

You can find podcasts on the podcasters official websites, one site with thousands of podcasts is called "iheart.com". You can also find podcasts on the "Podcast" app on Apple devices and the "Google podcasts" app on Android Devices. You can also use the free "Spotify" app on any device which hosts many podcasts to listen to.

Podcasts can be on a variety of topics. There are podcasts dedicated to sport, celebrities, gardening, science, pop culture, health and many, many more. You can listen to a podcast while traveling, gardening, doing housework, exercise or just because you want to listen. It is a very convenient way to be informed on your favourite topics or stay part of your community.

Hi Lovers of the Garden,

The next Garden club session will include activities involving a range of bulbs and how to plant them for flowering in spring. Also people have requested information regarding budding and grafting; so to prepare for that time in July, I will cover the theory and practice of various techniques, (also show a tool that can make the whole process easier). Those who missed out on the free strawberry plants in the last session will have that rectified this time. I indicated that my training involved culinary and medicinal herbs, so this session I will cover a useful Asian culinary herb. I will also cover techniques for growing your own plants from seed; particularly if the seed is extremely small.
