

Surge Protection

Sometimes our power grid experiences blackouts and brownouts as it temporarily loses power. When the power comes back, every device and appliance plugged in turns on all at once. This can cause what is called a power surge. Power surges occur when the flow of electricity is interrupted, then started again, or when something sends electricity flowing back into the system. Power surges can be dangerous to expensive TVs and desktop computers because the sudden flow of electricity can damage their power supply. This makes the power supply unstable and can damage expensive electronic components on the device. If the PC or TV is off when this happens, there's little to worry about but what about when it is running?

Damaging surges are much rarer now than it was years ago but still a possibility, especially if your desktop PC is on and running when a brownout occurs, causing a sudden surge. People can protect their devices with surge protection.

What is surge protection? Well one protection that comes with the house are the breakers on your electric panel. But they don't always trigger on minor surges, so what we are talking about today are surge protector power boards.

These are boards that will protect your devices from minor surges that could otherwise potentially damage your device. They can be inexpensive (and offer a little protection) or expensive (offer a lot of protection) and the surge protection doesn't last forever. This is because if there is a surge, they take the brunt of the surge and the protection inside wears down taking the damage instead.

Most protectors have a little red light on them telling you the protection is working. If the light goes out, it means they have protected the surge but the capacitor inside the board has worn out and it's now just a regular power board.

It's a good idea to have at least a surge protected power board for your PC and TV, I myself use a \$40 Belkin one on my PC, just for a little peace of mind if a surge happens.

Leopold Garden Club



The June meeting was well attended and attendees took great pleasure in having a taste of a variety of sponges during the coffee/tea break at half time.

This being a Garden Club, things gardening were also exchanged besides sponge recipes. Those that attended had the chance to receive a variety of plants: parsley, polyanthus, liliums, paintbrush lily, swan bush, strawberries and others. The main discussion was on grafting of fruit trees and the chance to ask for scions from members who will be pruning this winter.

The concept of Green Manure crops was also covered, for those who wish to rejuvenate their soil in any area of the garden. It involves growing a legume (pea or bean) to build up the nitrogen levels in the soil. The roots of most legumes can form nodes which allow the plant to take nitrogen in the air and transfer it to the soil. Later on, the plant can be harvested and dug into the soil (the green manure component).

Broad Beans are often used as they grow a reasonably sized plant (more green manure), have a useful crop, particularly if used when young and tender. The other advantage of the Broad Bean is that it will germinate at soil temperatures as low as 4degrees Celsius, ideal at a time when little will grow but weeds.

The next meeting will be held on the third Monday of July – 17th at 1.00 p.m. Cost is \$5.00 which includes a cuppa and biscuit.
