

Prepaid phone plans 2024

I recently got a notice that my prepaid phone plan was increasing from \$20 to \$25 soon. This is disappointing because when I first went with my plan the cheapest option was only \$10, now their cheapest is \$25. Only a few short years ago we had a renaissance in the industry of cheap phone plans, it was fantastic. But lately plans have skyrocketed in price. I can't tell you if those increases are justified or not with 3G shut down and carriers paying licenses for mobile space ext., but I can tell you I'm leaving my carrier because there are cheaper plans out there. I will now list the cheapest monthly prepaid plan I can find for each of the big three carriers: Telstra, Vodafone and Optus. Note this won't be their premium 5G plans except for Optus.

Only cheap plan with 5G if you want that.

I personally will be switching to Aldi because I want to use the Telstra network, it just seems to have better coverage where I live but your mileage may vary.
