



TRISTAN'S TECH TIPS

Why I recommend having at least two email addresses

When I was a child, I made my first email address. It was a "Hotmail" address, which at the time was the only free email addresses available. I signed up to all sorts of websites with that email address and learned a very important lesson nice and early: there are companies out there who will sell off your email address and you will end up with mountains of junk mail. It got so bad; I abandoned that email address and made a new one. Now I have several.

To minimise annoying spam or having your email address sold off, I highly recommend at least 2 email addresses.

The first email address will be one that you sign up to services that will probably eventually sell your address on to "marketing providers" who will then sell you to spammers. Use this email to sign up to things like "Netflix", "The Age" and real estate applications.

The second email address will be for personal correspondence or places you feel will be ok to give out your email to such as friends, family and your place of work. You will have a much cleaner and less stressful inbox where if you get an email, it is likely actually important.

You can even split off from here with even more email addresses if you like. I have a work-related email that only receives emails that are relevant to my job, an email just for my Google account and emails for specific websites and accounts. If one email address gets compromised, no matter because it has nothing to do with my other email addresses.

In today's world, two emails are essential, even if just so you don't need to wade through the spam and advertisements to get to the relevant emails you are after. So, feel free to make some free "Outlook" and "Gmail" accounts, they are free after all!

The process is very simple and will give an indication of your soil type and its likely characteristics with regard to gardening and plant nutrition.
